Leap Year

The Romans, whatever their success in war, politics, and law, were poor in science. The Romans left science to the Greeks, and as Greek fortunes declined, science too declined into what was eventually a dark age.

It is not surprising then, that the Romans used a calendar far worse than those used by any of the nations to its east. And since that calendar was occasionally manipulated by political priests for partisan advantage, it grew worse with time rather than better.

Julius Caesar admired the Egyptian solar calendar and brought in a Greek astronomer, Sosigenes, to work out a version of that calendar for use at Rome.

Thus originated the Julian calendar (names in Caesar's honor) of 365 days, with some months of 30 days and some of 31, plus an added day every four years (Leap Year).

The additional day was added because the year is actually 365 ¼ days long, and in this respect the Julian calendar was an improvement over the Egyptian. (The Julian calendar, with a small correction made 16 centuries later, is still in use today.)
