We are so blessed to have a great supporting family. Thank you for praying for our situation and for our family! God has proven Himself faithful so far, and we trust that He will continue to protect us and provide for us. What a great God we serve, and it is our pleasure to know that we have you friends to pray for us and to support us financially as well.

Over the past few months there have been special offerings given towards our start up fund! We are so thankful that God laid it on your hearts to go above and beyond to contribute to us. Thank you so much! We are about \$2,500 short of where we want to be by the time that we leave. If you would pray for that, we would appreciate it. If you want to contribute towards it, you can send money to our support address; just be sure to designate it for our family and for "start up funds" so that Bro Rudy will know to set it aside for us. I'm always impressed by the generosity of the saints. Only God can take human beings and teach us to go against our selfish nature and give for His glory!

We've had many people ask lately how everything is going with us and our visas. We have been in contact Bro Gray, the missionary who is handling our paperwork. He just made a trip to the capital to check on our paperwork. We still haven't gotten the approval we need. He asked us to pray for patience in dealing with the government. PNG is in favor of missionaries coming in to the country, but they are still a third-world country and their speed of processing reflects that. Please continue to pray! Also, if you could remember Bro Gray; he recently broke a few ribs. That would be an injury that would hamper you in the USA, but in PNG its much worse. He has a hard time driving on the rough roads. Please pray that he heals. His ministry would benefit, and his journey on our behalf to the capital would be much more comfortable!

We are praying that God would allow our visas to come through shortly. If we aren't approved so that we can leave before July, the ticket prices will rise dramatically. In my human understanding, it seems that it would be wise to leave with prices low to conserve God's provision for us, but we also know that if God wants us to leave when prices are high, He can provide the funds. Please pray that we are able to leave before the prices go up.

We've had the privilege to present our work in churches as well as report to a few of our supporting churches. I'm so thankful for those churches that have supported us through the beginning of our deputation! We visited a church that was one of our first supporters, but hadn't met Juliette yet! It's good to know someone is holding our rope as we try and descend on Papua New Guinea.

On the way home from the last night of our most recent string of meetings, the transmission in our vehicle failed. We were about 20 min from home. We were able to limp it back in 2nd gear so that we didn't need a tow. We were so thankful that it didn't result in an accident. I was able to learn how to rebuild it with one of the mechanics in our church. I'm so thankful for the knowledge that we gained through this trial. The experience will be helpful with repairing vehicles in Papua New Guinea!
