Hello to our friends and prayer partners!

As always, thanks for keeping up with us. We realize that there is always so much to pray about and we are happy that you take time to mention us to our Lord!

We've had people ask recently how Madilenne is doing, so let me give a quick summary. She has not been in a life threatening situation since November! It took till about February for all of her hormone levels to regulate. She had a lot of hormones that built up in her blood and it took time to use them and to expel them. We noticed that her growth curve was a bit off. Nothing to be worried about, just something to keep an eye on. We think this is because of those higher hormone levels from earlier this year. Now that she is more regulated, it looks like she is catching up to where she should be. All in all, we are ready to take her back to PNG from a health standpoint.

One of the blessings of being part of a team of missionaries is that the work can still continue while we are here in the USA. Kirsten Wells has been holding a ladies class once a week on the mission station in an effort to correct some cultural problems that hinder a christian marriage. One of the issues they've been working through is what it means to properly submit to their imperfect husbands. This class has opened their eyes to their need to work TOGETHER with their husbands to make their family something that pleases God. Please pray for our Kumiane ladies as they continue to learn and put in practice these lessons. It has been awesome to hear their testimonies of God working since some of them have put God's methods in marriage to the test. I'm excited to see our little church grow stronger as the families grow more pleasing to God!



Please pray for Maria. She has been growing and enjoying her new life in Christ. She struggles with old dead religion at times. One of these struggles was about baptism. She didn't understand that her previous experience was not the same as true salvation. This led to her not seeing a need to be "re-baptized". God finally got through to her through teaching at church, and through Kirsten being able to articulate it well to her. We are happy to see her grow.



Pray for Loretta! She got saved a few weeks before we rushed back to the USA. She has been growing so well. She has agreed to learn how to teach in the Sunday School at Kumiane. We are excited for the zeal that she is showing in her life as well as her outreach!

Pray as we prepare to go back to PNG. We still have a few obstacles in the way. Many offices are still closed, and we need to apply for Madi's SSN and have Adrienne's and Juliette's passports renewed. Please pray that we would be able to get their PNG visas in their new passports, and that adding Madilenne to our visa would be fast and easy. Please pray as we ship our crate of medical supplies and equipment that we will need to keep Madi healthy. Please pray that the shipping cost would be provided for us.

Please pray that we would have wisdom in when to return. Right now, it seems possible to fly to PNG. Things are very up in the air with flights and routes to get there. Countries are changing restrictions and mandates almost weekly, so we are trying to be careful not to waste money on flights that would be cancelled, or would strand us. When we arrive, as of this letter, we will have to quarantine for 14 days in a hotel in the capital city. This is going to add a few thousand dollars to our cost in getting back. There's just so much to think of and consider as we try to get back. We miss PNG, our home, our people, our work, we miss what God has for us there, but we are waiting on Him for His leading and direction. Pray that we move when He directs us too, and pray that we are diligent in what we need to do on this side of the Pacific.
