To those who love and pray for us,

What a crazy past few months its been!

First, thanks for praying for our baptism Sunday. We had 8 believers get baptized. We were so happy to see the growth in these Christians. We even had some younger girls get baptized as well. Typically it has been very difficult for us to get children and teens to follow the ordinance of baptism, so this was a great victory for our little church. Adrienne also got baptized! We were so happy, and it was such a sweet moment. We had asked her before we came back if she wanted to get baptized at our home church or in the river at Kumiane; she chose the river immediately! What a blessing to see God working in our young Christians and in our family!

Thanks for praying for Kayleigh. Unfortunately her pneumonia did not improve. We ended up taking her into the Kudjip Hausik to get her checked out. Over the course of a week, they had her take antibiotics and tried to get some x-rays to track the problem. After pulling fluid out of her chest, they realized that Kay had a pocket of pus left over from the pneumonia between her lungs and her ribs. They gave us one night to get ready and then she went "under the knife" so they could install a chest tube to drain everything out. We are so thankful that she's doing much better since she received the treatment. Many Christians also kept up with us as we posted updates on social media. We counted hundreds of Chrstians praying for Kay, and it meant so much to us to know that you all are still holding the ropes as we try to minister here!

Due to Kayleigh's sickness, we also had a chance to observe some spiritual fruit from our people in Kumiane. They sent one of the ladies from church to stay with Kay in the evenings while Justin was with the kids at the hotel about 45 min away. This was especially meaningful as they didn't ask for money for the bus to come in, for us to buy food to take care of them, or for pay for taking the time to watch her. They truly ministered to our family in a way that we've not heard happen to any other missionaries. They treated us like they would have treated their own family members. If our family hadn't gone through that, we wouldn't have seen this remarkable growth that they've manifested. We are still marvelling about it a few weeks removed from the experience.

We found a way for Madilenne's tests to come in and we have purchased one year's supply. At least for now, we will be set. We will still need to readdress the situation next year, but we have some time.

Please pray for the Church at Kumiane. We are getting ready to start felling trees and we need to rent or borrow a sawmill locally so we can cut the boards needed to start construction on a church building. It has been a long time coming. We know that God had us out of the country last year for a reason, and we know that our people have grown through this experience. They struggled at times with feeling insecure about meeting under a tarp. We can see God's hand in this as they have definitely grown!
