Thanks for those who've prayed over the events that we had planned! God worked and is continuing to work as we move forward.

At **youth camp in January** we saw 6 kids saved, and God worked in many of the sessions as we preached! It was a good week and encouraging for the kids who attended. Please pray as next month we will be putting on another youth camp geared towards youth that is currently attending church faithfully. This will happen the week before Resurrection Sunday during the school break.

We've also been preaching out a lot at some of the other local churches. We were happy to participate in the **meeting in Kauapini** with Marimari Baptist Sios (Grace Baptist Church) and Pastor Kesh. This was the first church that we visited in country way back in 2013. Justin preached 6 times over 3 days for them, and Kayleigh and Melanie worked to put on a 1 day kids program on Sunday afternoon. God worked in services and we are thankful.

We are in week 4 of **Bible College classes**, and things are going well. Please pray that our students wouldn't be discouraged by the workload and that they would see blessings for their diligence. We have quite a spectrum of education represented and we are trying to strike that careful balance of coming to their level and training them to the next level. Pray for guidance and that God's Word would be effective in this endeavor.

We kicked off our **youth group** in Kumiane again. We had over 30 kids our first night and the kids were excited. We are happy to restart this as it was a huge net for souls across the hauslain. This is one thing where we pull kids from all the different churches who wouldn't be able to come on a Sunday morning or to a regular service, but who will come and hear the Gospel in this program. This yielded some of our first fruits of 2019, and we look forward to what God will do.

Last week Sunday we woke to a **fire in our printshop**. Someone had set it at dawn and fortunately it was found fast enough that we could put it out before any printing equipment was damaged. While we have some work to do to clean it up, we are thankful that presses and folders and cutters all seem to be intact. This summer we are hoping to be able to repair the two walls and ceiling, and to be able to use this opportunity to add an addition onto the printshop. Ideally this will be two stories with another classroom, but we will see. We already have some visitors slated to come, as restrictions in our country are easing. If you'd like to come this summer and to try and help with our construction, we would love to host you here in Pangia. If you're interested, send us an email and we can try and put together teams of visitors and get this thing up quickly. What a testimony for our people it would be to move forward despite attempts to hinder God's work in the Southern Highlands of Papua New Guinea!
