Greetings and Happy New Year,

We are excited as we begin 2026. Last year, our furlough, went so well. God has seen fit to provide much of our ministry needs through your support and offerings this past year. We are looking forward to getting all of those materials and equipment loaded and sent off to PNG for use in the King's service!

We are still gathering estimates and timetables on our container. It appears that we are going to need to size up to a 40-foot container as there have been awesome donations to our team in the last month. Please continue to pray for wisdom and favor in dealing with companies and governments as we move these provisions to our field.

We have had medical supplies coming in from many sources. We have been blessed to have our CAH affected kids' medicines taken care of so that we can have a few years supply for PNG. We have had different materials and medicines donated to the PMT clinic. In two weeks, Justin will be traveling to a meeting where the pastor of the hosting church has been able to pass on a great deal of supplies for us to bring back to New York and pack into the container. God certainly knows what we need and when we need it. This provision came at a time when we were pretty discouraged about the clinic and its future, however God used that and the timing of it to encourage us as we move forward in that compassionate ministry. Please continue to lift that ministry up in prayer and that we would be able to affect people with the love of God and that they would look to Jesus for eternal life through him alone!

Thank you for those who've prayed for Madilene. Our furlough has gone on a few months longer than we had intended, however in taking care of these details for her, we are able to have a bit more stable path forward this next term. Her urologist was able to make the necessary corrections, and we've had the first of two follow up visits. As it stands, she is healing up nicely from the procedure. She is scheduled to go under general anesthesia on February 13th where they will scope her urogenital sinus to determine that everything is healing internally as well. This will just be a few hours or so, but it will be the last appointment that she will need before we can plan to go back. The doctor is expecting everything to look well and so we are planning on purchasing tickets after that date.

Please pray for our visas as they have not been issued as of yet. This isn't a surprise as PNG doesn't do very much office work in December, but we are expecting our documents to be issued soon. Please pray for John Gray as he submits applications and follows up on them for us. He is the missionary that helps to sponsor us into PNG.

We have a few meetings these next few weeks and we are packing our container. It will be busy, but we are looking forward to getting back to our field and getting to work. There seems to be an insurmountable share of work to accomplish, but we are honored and privileged that God would entrust these things to our family. We are blessed to be able to go as your representatives to this field. Thank you all for your prayers and for your support in our endeavors to carry the Gospel beyond ourselves!
