

Thank you for your prayer and support for our family over the past few months. As we wind down our time in the USA, we have been reminded of the care our Lord gives us and of the love that you send our way. Thank you, as always, for these relationships that you maintain with us. You are a blessing and you enable us to keep working in PNG!

We have sold the RV. Thank you to those who've prayed for that. We were able to sell it to a dear friend who will be using it in ministry as well. We are so happy that this vehicle can continue to be used in the service of the King, and we are relieved to have that checked off our list of things to take care of before we go back.

We also have our 40' container on site at FBBC. We are now packing the container with the supplies that we have been gathering. Some things are still in transit to us, so please pray that everything arrives in a timely manner and that we are able to fit everything and get it on the ship in a perfectly timely manner.

Madilenne's appointment with her surgeon went very well. She tolerated the procedure and we have obtained a good report! Madilenne will need some follow up in the years to come, but for our next term we are cleared to go. Everything came out exactly as we were praying, and internally she seems to be healing very well. We are so happy to have been able to handle this before going back to PNG. It is a major relief to cross this off of our long term list. Both Madilenne and Lachlann are stable in their current blood-work and we are in a great position to bring them into our personal care in PNG.

We do not have our Visa clearance as of yet. We had to submit new paperwork and credentials, but they are received and in processing. We have been informed that Justin's visa will be approved any day, and after that the applications for Kayleigh and the children will be submitted. Papua New Guinea has had some changes in policy in the last few months, and this is a new one for us. However, we are happy to see the progress so far. We are hopeful that we will get an approval in the next few weeks. This process has been months long in years past, but it has been weeks long for other missionaries that we've seen apply. Please pray for our applications to be approved soon. Once that's done, we can purchase our return tickets and get back to work.

As we set things into the container, we are reminded of just how much the Lord has provided for the upcoming term. The advances that the clinic will be able to make, the different pieces of equipment to be used down on the rivers in Kikori or up in Pangia, and the things that we are able to bring back to help the school and our church are all a testament to God working in and through you all. People across our country will be helped and be able to hear of our Saviour because of the things that you've provided. Thank you for your enabling us to go forward and thank you for your prayerful support.

We are excited, we are hopeful, and we feel blessed as we prepare to return.
