Hello from Papua New Guinea!

We are back in Pangia and we are working on getting things up and running again.

Thank you for the prayers on our behalf. Our container is en-route from Singapore and should land in PNG the first week of October. Please pray that we are able to clear customs and is transported safely to Pangia. Should anything happen to it in transit, there will be no insurance claim or avenue to replace it.

Thank you for praying about our travel into the country! We were able to fly for the best price we've ever paid and we had the best layovers we've ever had. Usually we are sitting in an airport in a 14 hour layover, but we were able to make connections that had 3 hour layovers. We waited at a gate for boarding for maybe 30 min as the longest wait. This helped our family to not be so tired and stressed as we traveled and we appreciated it so much. We also had a potentially lost bag. As many know, we transport medical tests for Madilenne and Lachlann as we travel. These supplies must be kept cold and never frozen during transit. In Fiji, we collected bags to clear customs and the bag that had these supplies was nowhere to be found. We filed the report and had some people check on them. Ultimately we had to just check in less one bag. When we arrived in PNG and cleared immigration, the lost bag was on the baggage carousel! We aren't entirely sure how it got rechecked to Port Moresby, but we are glad that it did. The Lord actually saved us paying for the extra bag and got it there without the charge. That box of cold supplies is always the most critical part of our travel and we are so happy that it make it here intact and on time.

We have been working on unpacking all of what we stored, fixing things on the vehicle that had gone bad, straightening out power supply issues in our house, reconnecting with our church, and generally getting things back in order so we can ramp up into ministry again. Please pray as this process will take a few months.

In the mean time, pray as in the last quarter of the year our team will be hosting an outreach with a large group traveling in from out of country. Please pray as we are making preparations for that even now. There's a lot of logistical wrinkles that could get in the way of a great spiritual work, and we want to do our best to minimize those things so that we can successfully get to those who need to hear the Gospel!

Please pray for our church at Kumiane. They did really well for being without us as long as they did, but there are always going to be things that need attention. Please pray with us that our congregation would fall madly in love with our Saviour and would yield to His word. They have great intentions and they are lovely pictures of God's grace, however we can see where there needs to be growth. Pray that the preaching, teaching, and counseling would be appropriate and tailored to exactly what they need.

Thanks as always for praying. We are excited to be back and in the saddle again. We enjoyed our time in the USA and the time we had with our home church, but this is where God wants us to be. Thank you for your care for us as well. We are able to attempt great things for God because of your faithful support. May God be glorified.
