Ben Franklin once said, "The sentence which has most influenced my life is, 'Some persons grumble because God has placed thorns among roses. Why not thank God He placed roses among thorns?' I first read it when but a mere lad. Since that day it has occupied a front room in my life and has given it an optimistic trend."

The late Dr. Paul Rees tells the true story of a man whose job was to transport people committed to a mental hospital.

After delivering a patient one day, he was walking back to his car when he heard a voice call out, "Hey

you!" It came from one of the upper floors.

Looking up, the man called back, "Are you speaking to me?"

"Yes," came the reply, "I want to ask

you a question. Have you ever thanked God that you have a healthy



mind?"

To say the least, the driver was stunned. He said, "I suddenly realized that I had been bringing people to this facility for some fifteen years. Yet I had never once thank God for a good mind."

Helen Keller, who was both blind and deaf, spoke glowingly of **thanksgiving: "For three things I thank God every day of my life:** thanks that He has vouchsafed [promised] me knowledge of His works;



deep thanks that he has set in my darkness the lamp of faith; deep, deepest thanks that I have another life to look forward — a life joyous with light and flowers and heavenly song."

Kimbrough's Robbery

As Dr. J.B. Kimbrough was traveling from one appointment to another through a secluded forest, he was confronted by two highwaymen. Holding their guns on the man of God, they insisted that he dismount from his horse and hand over all his money.

"Very well, gentlemen, please give me a little time, and I will obey your orders," Kimbrough responded.

After dismounting, he laid his money in two piles, then, turning to the highway men, he said:

"Gentlemen, this small pile of money is mine: you are at liberty to rob me of that; the larger pile is God's money, and I dare you to touch it. I collected it for the young

preachers of the state who are struggling for an education at Carson **and Newman College."**

The earnestness and courage of the man

attracted the attention of the robbers, and they began to inquire into the work in which he was engaged. He

told them he was a Baptist preacher and explained to them his mission.

After hearing what he had to say, the elder of the two young men **said: "We will not take either your money or the money of the young preachers."**

Turning to the young men, and looking them full in the face, Dr **Kimbrough added: "Young men, you are in a mighty bad business. I believe you ought to give it up. In the meantime, I will be grateful if you will help me in the work in which I am engaged."**

Following this appeal, the robbers gave him \$5 each for the young preachers, whereupon the faithful minister mounted his horse, and all rode away, going in different directions.
