Teach When It's Ok to Scream

Do you allow your youngster to kick, scream or yell in a public place? Chances are, you don't and you'd have a few choice words to say about parents who do.

But some children who have been abducted from places such as shopping centers have gone quietly with their captors because they have been told never to be noisy, says Pam McDonnel, co-founder of the Safety and Fitness Exchange (SAFE) Inc. of New York City.

Young children should be taught that there are times when kicking, screaming, and biting are the right things to do. "A child who is screaming, 'This is not my mother,' while being abducted from a public place is bound to attract some attention," she said.

Parents should tell their children that the best thing to do is yell and run away. "Tell them, if they can't run away because the person is holding on to them, that it's all right to bite, kick or hit, or do anything they need to," she said.

Would be molesters or attackers usually attempt to con children first. "A con is a trick, something like coming to a schoolyard and telling a child that his mother has been hit by a car and taken to the hospital," she explained. "Then the abductor will tell the child that his mother said he should go with him."
