SIGNERS OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE



Signer #15: William Floyd (1734-1821)

New York. Age at signing: 41

Married: Hannah; Joanna (8 children)

Occupation: Land Owner

Quotes & Notes:

The declaration ends with the words, "we mutually pledge to each other our lives, our fortress, and our sacred honor."

On the island, William Floyd's estate was looted. The house was stripped of everything. The farm implements and livestock in his pastures were stolen; the extensive timberlands he had preserved were razed. After the house and grounds were looted, a party of British cavalry was quartered on the estate. Men and horses alike turned the house into a shambles.

His fine estate was exposed to the rude uses of the British soldiery, and his family were obliged to seek shelter and protection in Connecticut. His mansion was the rendezvous for a party of cavalry, his cattle and sheep were used as provision for the British army, and for seven years he derived not a dollar of income from his property.

Floyd, all of whose estates were on Long Island, suffered deprivation of income for seven years. His wife and children were forced to live off the hospitality of friends. Hannah Jones Floyd never saw her home again.

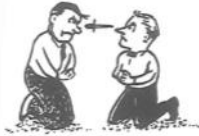
