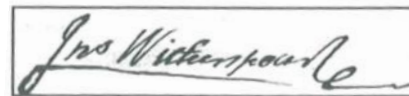

SIGNERS OF THE DECLARATION OF INDEPENDENCE



Signer #23: John Witherspoon (1723-1791) New Jersey. Age at signing: 53
Married: Elizabeth (10 children, 5 survived infancy), Ann (2 children)

Quotes & Notes:

John Witherspoon was born in Edinburgh, Scotland to a Presbyterian clergyman, and most sources claim he was a direct descendant of John Knox, the founder of Protestantism in Scotland. By age 4, John could read the Bible.

Witherspoon published several books of Gospel sermons, and played major roles in two American editions of the Bible, including one from 1791, considered to be America's first family Bible.

To remind people that he believed God was on America's side, he always wore his minister's clothes to Congress. Even when America's prospects looked bleak, Witherspoon remained a beacon of hope, despite his personal sufferings.

In 1777, John and Elizabeth's son James was killed at the Battle of Germantown in what is now Philadelphia. The British wrecked the Witherspoon farm near Princeton, and part of the Battle of Princeton in 1777 was fought right on the college campus. The college was damaged so extensively that it had to close for a time.

John Witherspoon urged: "I entreat you in the most earnest manner to believe in Jesus Christ, for 'there is no salvation in any other' . . . If you are not reconciled to God through Jesus Christ, if you are not clothed with the spotless robe of His righteousness, you must forever perish."
