This book was written in the last years of Solomon's life. The concluding chapters contain some of the most important truths you can ever learn!

What is the Book of Romans About?

The poet Samuel Taylor Coleridge regarded Romans as "the most profound book in existence," and the commentator Godet called it "the cathedral of the Christian faith." Because of its majestic declaration of the divine plan of salvation, Martin Luther wrote: "This epistle is the chief part of the New Testament and the very purest gospel...it can never be read or pondered too much, and the more it is dealt with the more precious it becomes and the better it tastes."

The four Gospels present the words and works of the Lord Jesus, but Romans, "The Gospel According to Paul," delves more into the **significance of His death and resurrection**. The theology of Romans is balanced by practical exhortation, because Paul sees the believer's position as the basis for his practice. The theme of **righteousness** that runs through the book is reflected in the following outline: the revelation of the righteousness of God (1-8); the vindication of the righteousness of God (9-11); the application of the righteousness of God (12-16).
