Proverbs 15:

<sup>1</sup> A soft answer turneth away wrath:  
but grievous words stir up anger.

<sup>2</sup> The tongue of the wise useth  
knowledge aright: but the mouth of  
fools poureth out foolishness.

<sup>3</sup> The eyes of the LORD are in every  
place, beholding the evil and the good.

<sup>4</sup> A wholesome tongue is a tree of life:  
but perverseness therein is a breach  
in the spirit.

<sup>5</sup> A fool despiseth his father's in-  
struction: but he that regardeth re-  
proof is prudent.

<sup>6</sup> In the house of the righteous is  
much treasure: but in the revenues  
of the wicked is trouble.

<sup>7</sup> The lips of the wise disperse knowl-  
edge: but the heart of the foolish  
doeth not so.

<sup>8</sup> The sacrifice of the wicked is an  
abomination to the LORD: but the  
prayer of the upright is his delight.

<sup>9</sup> The way of the wicked is an abomi-  
nation unto the LORD: but he loveth  
him that followeth after righteous-  
ness.

<sup>10</sup> Correction is grievous unto him  
that forsaketh the way: and he that  
hateth reproof shall die.

<sup>11</sup> Hell and destruction are before the  
LORD: how much more then the  
hearts of the children of men?

<sup>12</sup> A scorner loveth not one that  
reproveth him: neither will he go unto  
the wise.

<sup>13</sup> A merry heart maketh a cheerful  
countenance: but by sorrow of the  
heart the spirit is broken.

<sup>14</sup> The heart of him that hath under-  
standing seeketh knowledge: but the  
mouth of fools feedeth on foolishness.

<sup>15</sup> All the days of the afflicted are evil:  
but he that is of a merry heart hath a  
continual feast.

<sup>16</sup> Better is little with the fear of the  
LORD than great treasure and trouble  
therewith.

<sup>17</sup> Better is a dinner of herbs where  
love is, than a stalled ox and hatred  
therewith.
