## Lesson #42 – Proverbs 28:1-13 – December 15, 2004

### Proverbs 28:

<sup>1</sup> The wicked flee when no man pursueth: but the righteous are bold as a lion.

<sup>2</sup> For the transgression of a land many are the princes thereof: but by a man of understanding and knowledge the state thereof shall be prolonged.

<sup>3</sup> A poor man that oppresseth the poor is like a sweeping rain which leaveth no food.

<sup>4</sup> They that forsake the law praise the wicked: but such as keep the law contend with them.

<sup>5</sup> Evil men understand not judgment: but they that seek the LORD understand all things.

<sup>6</sup> Better is the poor that walketh in his uprightness, than he that is perverse in his ways, though he be rich.

<sup>7</sup> Whoso keepeth the law is a wise son: but he that is a companion of riotous men shameth his father.

<sup>8</sup> He that by usury and unjust gain increaseth his substance, he shall gather it for him that will pity the poor.

<sup>9</sup> He that turneth away his ear from hearing the law, even his prayer shall be abomination.

<sup>10</sup> Whoso causeth the righteous to go astray in an evil way, he shall fall himself into his own pit: but the upright shall have good things in possession.

<sup>11</sup> The rich man is wise in his own conceit; but the poor that hath understanding searcheth him out.

<sup>12</sup> When righteous men do rejoice, there is great glory: but when the wicked rise, a man is hidden.

<sup>13</sup> He that covereth his sins shall not prosper: but whoso confesseth and forsaketh them shall have mercy.
